# Program Learning Outcomes for the Minor in Creative Writing

Upon completing the minor in Creative Writing, students will be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate an understanding of the relationship of literature and literary production to their historical and socio-cultural contexts.
- 2. Provide concrete and constructive editorial critiques with an emphasis on craft, form, and genre aligned with an author's perspective and purpose.
- Produce original creative works including but not limited to fictional prose, literary essays, cultural criticism, poetry, plays, translation, screenplays, and other media.

# Requirements for the Minor in Creative Writing

Students pursuing the minor in Creative Writing must complete:

- A minimum of 6 courses (18 credit hours) to satisfy minor requirements.
- A minimum of 3 courses (9 credit hours) taken at the 300-level or above
- · A minimum of 1 course (3 credit hours) at the 400-level.
- · A minimum of 1 course (3 credit hours) in a second genre or form.
- A maximum of 2 courses (6 credit hours) from study abroad or transfer credit. For departmental guidelines regarding transfer credit, see the Policies tab.

The courses listed below satisfy the requirements for this minor. In certain instances, courses not on this official list may be substituted upon approval of the minor's academic advisor, or where applicable, the Program Director. (Course substitutions must be formally applied and entered into Degree Works by the minor's <a href="Official Certifier">Official Certifier</a> (<a href="https://registrar.rice.edu/facstaff/degreeworks/officialcertifier/">Officialcertifier/</a>)). Students and their academic advisors should identify and clearly document the courses to be taken.

#### **Footnotes and Additional Information**

- Of the 6 required courses (18 credit hours) for the minor at least 3 creative writing courses must be at the 300-level or above, at least one course must be at the 400-level, and at least one course must be in a second genre or form (such as poetry, non-fiction, screenwriting, translation, publishing, etc.). Students should select Elective coursework with an advisor.
- Students may take additional Core Requirements to fulfill Elective Requirements, but the course(s) will not count toward both requirements.
- Up to 1 course (3 credit hours) from departments other than English (ENGL) course offerings may be chosen to fulfill Elective Requirements. (See course list below). However, other courses may be approved by an advisor.

#### **Footnotes and Additional Information**

Of the 6 required courses (18 credit hours) for the minor: at least 3 creative writing courses must be at the 300-level or above, at least one course must be at the 400-level, at least one course must be in a second genre or form (such as poetry, non-fiction, screenwriting, translation, publishing, etc.).

# Policies for the Minor in Creative Writing Program Restrictions and Exclusions

Students pursuing the minor in Creative Writing should be aware of the following program restrictions:

- As noted in Majors, Minors, and Certificates (https://ga.rice.edu/ undergraduate-students/academic-opportunities/majors-minorscertificates/), i.) students may declare their intent to pursue a minor only after they have first declared a major, and ii.) students may not major and minor in the same subject.
- Students pursuing the major in English and a major concentration in Creative Writing may not additionally declare the minor in Creative Writing.
- Students pursuing the major in English may also declare the minor in Creative Writing, provided that: i.) the student is *not* pursuing the major concentration in Creative Writing, *and* ii.) there is no course

overlap between the respective major in English and minor in Creative Writing.

#### **Transfer Credit**

### **Departmental Transfer Credit Guidelines**

Students pursuing the minor in Creative Writing should be aware of the following departmental transfer credit guidelines:

- No more than 2 courses (6 credit hours) of transfer credit from U.S. or international universities of similar standing as Rice may apply towards the minor.
- Requests for transfer credit will be considered by the program director (and/or the program's official transfer credit advisor) on an individual case-by-case basis.
