# BACHELOR OF ARTS (BA) DEGREE WITH A MAJOR IN OPERATIONS RESEARCH

## Program Learning Outcomes for the BA Degree with a Major in Operations Research

Upon completing the BA degree with a major in Operations Research, students will be able to:

- Formulate appropriate mathematical programs and stochastic processes that model real-world situations.
- Calibrate models with appropriate real-world data, using statistical and data science tools.
- Use commercial and open-source software to solve operations research models.
- Communicate the solutions and insights generated by operations research models to a non-technical audience.

### Requirements for the BA Degree with a Major in Operations Research

For general university requirements, see <u>Graduation Requirements</u> (https://ga.rice.edu/undergraduate-students/academic-policies-procedures/graduation-requirements/). Students pursuing the BA degree with a major in Operations Research must complete:

- A minimum of 17 courses (53-56 credit hours, depending on course selection) to satisfy major requirements.
- A minimum of 120 credit hours to satisfy degree requirements.
- A minimum of 11 courses (33-35 credit hours, depending on course selection) taken at the 300-level or above.
- A maximum of 4 courses (12 credit hours) from study abroad or transfer credit after matriculation at Rice may be applied towards specific major requirements. For additional departmental guidelines regarding transfer credit, see the <u>Policies</u> (p. 2) tab.

The courses listed below satisfy the requirements for this major. In certain instances, courses not on this official list may be substituted upon approval of the major's academic advisor or, where applicable, the department's Director of Undergraduate Studies. (Course substitutions must be formally applied and entered into Degree Works by the major's Official Certifier (https://registrar.rice.edu/facstaff/degreeworks/officialcertifier/).) Students and their academic advisors should identify and clearly document the courses to be taken.

#### **Footnotes and Additional Information**

Note: <u>University Graduation Requirements</u> include 31 credit hours, comprised of Distribution Requirements (Groups I, II, and III), FWIS, and LPAP coursework. In some instances, courses satisfying major requirements may additionally meet distribution requirements, such as the Analyzing Diversity (AD) requirement, or some of the student's declared major, minor, or certificate requirements. <u>Additional Credit Hours to Complete Degree Requirements</u> include general electives, coursework completed as upper-level, residency (hours taken at Rice), and/or any other additional academic program requirements.

## Policies for the BA Degree with a Major in Operations Research

#### **Program Restrictions and Exclusions**

Students pursuing the BA Degree with a Major in Operations Research should be aware of the following program restrictions:

- As noted in Majors, Minors, and Certificates (https://ga.rice.edu/undergraduate-students/academic-opportunities/majors-minors-certificates/), under Declaring Majors, Minors and Certificates, students may not obtain both a BA and a BS in the same major. Students pursuing the BA Degree in Operations Research may not additionally pursue the BS Degree with a Major in Operations Research.
- As noted in <u>Majors, Minors, and Certificates</u> (<a href="https://ga.rice.edu/undergraduate-students/academic-opportunities/majors-minors-certificates/">https://ga.rice.edu/undergraduate-students/academic-opportunities/majors-minors-certificates/</a>), students may not major and minor in the same subject.
- Students pursuing the major in Operations Research may not additionally declare the major in Computational and Applied Mathematics.
- Students pursuing the major in Operations Research may not additionally declare the minor in Computational and Applied Mathematics.

#### **Transfer Credit**

Some departments and programs have additional restrictions on transfer credit. Requests for transfer credit must be approved for Rice equivalency by the designated transfer credit advisor for the appropriate academic department offering the Rice equivalent course (corresponding to the subject code of the course content). #### **Departmental Transfer Credit Guidelines**

Students pursuing the major in Operations Research should be aware of the following program-specific transfer credit quideline:

 No more than 4 courses (12 credit hours) of transfer credit from U.S. or international universities of similar standing as Rice may apply towards major requirements after matriculation at Rice.

#### Fifth-Year Master's Degree Option for Rice Undergraduate Students

In certain situations and with some terminal master's degree programs, Rice students have an option to pursue a master's degree by adding an additional fifth year to their four years of undergraduate studies.

Advanced Rice undergraduate students in good academic standing typically apply to the master's degree program during their junior or senior year. Upon acceptance, depending on course load, financial aid status, and other variables, they may then start taking some required courses of the master's degree program. A plan of study will need to be approved by the student's undergraduate major advisor and the master's degree program director.

As part of this option and opportunity, Rice undergraduate students:

- must complete the requirements for a bachelor's degree and the master's degree independently of each other (i.e. no course may be counted toward the fulfillment of both degrees).
- should be aware there could be financial aid implications if the conversion of undergraduate coursework to that of graduate level reduces their earned undergraduate credit for any semester below that of full-time status (12 credit hours).
