# MINOR IN THE STUDY OF WOMEN, GENDER AND SEXUALITY

## Program Learning Outcomes for the Minor in the Study of Women, Gender and Sexuality

Upon completing the minor in the Study of Women, Gender and Sexuality, students will be able to:

- Demonstrate the ability to analyze the lived experience of gender and sexuality in various locations around the world, including the United States.
- 2. Demonstrate the ability to analyze feminist perspectives specific to postcolonial histories and the Global South.
- Demonstrate the ability to analyze a diversity of feminist, critical race, and gueer theories.
- Demonstrate knowledge of the concept of feminist engaged research

## Requirements for the Minor in the Study of Women, Gender and Sexuality

Students pursuing the minor in the Study of Women, Gender and Sexuality must complete:

- A minimum of 6 courses (18-19 credit hours, depending on course selection) to satisfy minor requirements.
- A minimum of 3 courses (9 credit hours) taken at the 300-level or above.
- A maximum of 2 courses (6 credit hours) from study abroad or transfer credit. For additional departmental guidelines regarding transfer credit, see the <u>Policies</u> (p. 3) tab.

The courses listed below satisfy the requirements for this minor. In certain instances, courses not on this official list may be substituted upon approval of the minor's academic advisor, or where applicable, the Program Director. (Course substitutions must be formally applied and entered into Degree Works by the minor's <a href="Official Certifier">Official Certifier</a> (<a href="https://registrar.rice.edu/facstaff/degreeworks/officialcertifier/">Officialcertifier/</a>)). Students and their academic advisors should identify and clearly document the courses to be taken.

- In lieu of 2 elective courses, students pursuing the minor may instead take the 3-course, 2-semester sequence of SWGS 494 PRE-SEMINAR IN ENGAGED RESEARCH (2 credit hours), SWGS 496 ENGAGED RESEARCH PRACTICUM (3 credit hours), and SWGS 497 ENGAGED RESEARCH SEMINAR (2 credit hours).

#### **Course Lists to Satisfy Requirements**

To fulfill elective requirements, students must complete a total of 4 courses (12-13 credit hours, depending on course selection) from the course lists below (from either the field-specific lists or the department-approved electives). A minimum of 3 courses (9 credit hours) must be taken at the 300-level or above. #### **Footnotes and Additional Information**

ENGL 397, LALX 238, PHIL 470, and RELI 238 are Special Topics courses. Therefore, these courses only count toward the Study of Women, Gender and Sexuality minor when the topic is related to the Study of Women, Gender and Sexuality. SWGS 238 and SWGS 477 only count toward a required area of specialization for the SWGS minor when the topic is related to that area of specialization. For questions regarding a specific instance of ENGL 397, LALX 238, PHIL 470, RELI 238, SWGS 238, or SWGS 477, consult the Center for the Study of Women, Gender and Sexuality (CSWGS) Director of Undergraduate Studies or the Center's Director.

## Policies for the Minor in the Study of Women, Gender and Sexuality

#### **Program Restrictions and Exclusions**

Students pursuing the minor in the Study of Women, Gender and Sexuality should be aware of the following program restriction:

 As noted in Majors, Minors, and Certificates (https://ga.rice.edu/ undergraduate-students/academic-opportunities/majors-minorscertificates/), i.) students may declare their intent to pursue a minor only after they have first declared a major, and ii.) students may not major and minor in the same subject.

#### **Transfer Credit**

Some departments and programs have additional restrictions on transfer credit. The Office of Academic Advising maintains the university's official list of <a href="transfer credit advisors">transfer credit advisors</a> (https://oaa.rice.edu/advising-network/transfer-credit-advisors/) on their website: <a href="https://oaa.rice.edu">https://oaa.rice.edu</a>. Students are encouraged to meet with their academic program's transfer credit advisor when considering transfer credit possibilities.

#### **Departmental Transfer Credit Guidelines**

Students pursuing the minor in the Study of Women, Gender and Sexuality should be aware of the following departmental transfer credit quidelines:

- No more than 2 courses (6 credit hours) of transfer credit from U.S. or international universities of similar standing as Rice may apply towards the minor.
- Requests for transfer credit will be considered by the Center for the Study of Women, Gender and Sexuality (CSWGS) Director of Undergraduate Studies, the Center's Director, (and/or the program's official transfer credit advisor) on an individual case-by-case basis.
- Courses taken at another university must be equivalent in required reading, writing, research and testing, as well as classroom hours,

- of a Rice course. Regarding subject matter, however, there does not have to be an equivalent course in the Rice course offerings, unless the student requires distribution credit.
- Rice students planning to study at a foreign university must also obtain pre-approval from the Rice Study Abroad Office.
- Transfer credit received via the articulation of approved exam credit, such as advanced placement (AP) credit, international baccalaureate (IB) credit, or A-level credit will not be considered towards minor requirements.

#### **Distribution Credit Information**

The determination of distribution credit eligibility is done initially as part of the <a href="new course creation process">new course creation process</a> (<a href="https://registrar.rice.edu/facstaff/courseprocess/">https://registrar.rice.edu/facstaff/courseprocess/</a>). Additionally, as part of an <a href="annual roll call">annual roll call</a> (<a href="https://registrar.rice.edu/facstaff/distribution\_credit/">https://registrar.rice.edu/facstaff/distribution\_credit/</a>) coordinated each Spring by the Office of the Registrar, course distribution credit eligibility is routinely reviewed and reaffirmed by the Dean's Offices of each of the academic schools.

Faculty and leadership in the academic schools are responsible for ensuring that the courses identified as distribution-credit-eligible meet the criteria as set in the <a href="General Announcements">General Announcements</a> (<a href="https://ga.rice.edu/undergraduate-students/academic-policies-procedures/graduation-requirements/#text">https://ga.rice.edu/undergraduation-requirements/academic-policies-procedures/graduation-requirements/#text</a>)

By completing coursework designated as distribution-credit-eligible at the time of course registration.

Distribution courses from the Study of Women, Gender and Sexuality (SWGS) are broad in theme and scope and prompt students to probe knowledge about how gender and sexuality are crucial components of political life, social life, and general well-being. They involve a broad, interdisciplinary spectrum of such knowledge and provide students with the tools for thinking critically about formations of gender and sexuality in diverse contexts. Current SWGS DI courses are our core courses that are 100- and 200-level introductions to the study of women, gender, and sexuality. (Courses that originate in other departments and, whether formally cross-listed or not, fulfill SWGS requirements may or may not be distribution courses. Please check the course description.)
