- 2. Understand management as an interdisciplinary field and demonstrate the ability to use critical thinking to synthesize key knowledge, theories, and research across different disciplines.
- Develop quantitative/statistical analysis and research skills in order to perform evidence-based analysis of business problems and proposals.
- 4. Demonstrate the ability to communicate analysis and research findings in written and oral formats.

Requirements for the BA Degree with a Major in Managerial Economics and Organizational Sciences

- A minimum of 15 courses (46-50 credit hours, depending on course selection) to satisfy major requirements.
- A minimum of 120 credit hours to satisfy degree requirements.
- A minimum of 5 courses (15 credit hours) taken at the 300-level or above.
- A maximum of 5 courses (15 credit hours) from study abroad or transfer credit *after* matriculation at Rice may be applied towards specific major requirements. For additional departmental guidelines regarding transfer credit, see the <u>Policies</u> (p. 2) tab.
- A Capstone Requirement.

Footnotes and Additional Information

- * Note: <u>University Graduation Requirements</u> include 31 credit hours, comprised of Distribution Requirements (Groups I, II, and III), FWIS, and LPAP coursework. In some instances, courses satisfying FWIS or distribution requirements may additionally meet other requirements, such as the Analyzing Diversity (AD) requirement, or some of the student's declared major, minor, or certificate requirements. <u>Additional Credit Hours to Complete Degree</u> <u>Requirements</u> include general electives, coursework completed as upper-level, residency (hours taken at Rice), and/or any other additional academic program requirements.
- ¹ BUSI 343 may be substituted for ECON 343; STAT 449 may be substituted for ECON 449.
- ² Students may select up to 1 course (3 credit hours) from approved coursework outside departmental (ECON) course offerings to fulfill the Management, Economics, and Analytical Methods category within the Elective Requirements (see course list below).
- ³ In order to fulfill the Capstone Requirement, students must complete MEOS 404 in the senior year, after completing at least half of the major requirements.

Policies for the BA Degree with a Major in Managerial Economics and Organizational Sciences

Program Restrictions and Exclusions

Students pursuing the major in Managerial Economics and Organizational Sciences should be aware of the following program restrictions:

- Students pursuing the major in Managerial Economics and Organizational Sciences may not additionally declare the major in Economics.
- Students pursuing the major in Managerial Economics and Organizational Sciences may not additionally declare the major in Mathematical Economic Analysis.

Transfer Credit

Some departments and programs have additional restrictions on transfer credit. Students are encouraged to meet with their academic program's transfer credit advisor when considering transfer credit possibilities.

Program Transfer Credit Guidelines

Students pursuing the major in Managerial Economics and Organizational Sciences should be aware of the following programspecific transfer credit guidelines:

- Requests for transfer credit will be considered by the program director (and/or the program's official transfer credit advisor) on an individual case-by-case basis.
- Students seeking transfer credit should contact the appropriate department with requests for approval (i.e. transfer credit requests for PSYC courses must be approved as equivalents by the Psychological Sciences department).
- No more than 5 courses (15 credit hours) of transfer credit from U.S. or international universities of similar standing as Rice may apply towards specific major requirements *after* matriculation at Rice.

Please Note: Additional transfer courses may count toward meeting university graduation requirements, but not toward fulfillment of requirements for the major. Credits awarded to transfer students for courses taken *prior* to matriculation at Rice are not counted against the departmental limit on transfer courses, but all students must complete more than half of their upper-level major coursework (300-level and 400level courses) at Rice.
