- Develop critical analysis, problem solving and research skills in order to design and evaluate evidence-based interventions for social problems.
- 3. Demonstrate the ability to communicate policy research and findings clearly and persuasively in written and oral formats.
- Analyze public problems, evaluate policy alternatives against criteria such as equity, efficiency, and effectiveness, and demonstrate knowledge and understanding of social policy analysis tools and methods.
- Demonstrate mastery of the above outcomes in the senior capstone project.

Requirements for the BA Degree with a Major in Social Policy Analysis

- A minimum of 13 courses (39-40 credit hours, depending on course selection) to satisfy major requirements.
- A minimum of 120 credit hours required to satisfy degree requirements.
- A minimum of 5 courses (15 credit hours) taken at the 300-level or above
- A maximum of 2 courses (6 credit hours) from study abroad or transfer credit. For additional program guidelines regarding transfer credit, see the <u>Policies</u> (p. 4) tab.

In certain instances, courses not on this official list may be substituted upon approval of the major's academic advisor, or where applicable, the department's Director of Undergraduate Studies.
