# BACHELOR OF ARTS (BA) DEGREE WITH A MAJOR IN SPORT MANAGEMENT AND A MAJOR CONCENTRATION IN SPORT LAW

### Program Learning Outcomes for the BA Degree with a Major in Sport Management and a Major Concentration in Sport Law

Upon completing the BA Degree with a major in Sport Management and a major concentration in Sport Law, students will be able to:

- 1. Communicate effectively both orally and in writing.
- 2. Develop and hone professional skills through classroom learning, experiential learning, and field research through a steady progression of internships.
- Demonstrate the ability to produce a marketing plan specific to product in the sport industry.
- Demonstrate the ability to utilize and communicate legal concepts as they relate to the sport industry, such as risk management, governing bodies, and ethics.

## Requirements for the BA Degree with a Major in Sport Management and a Major Concentration in Sport Law

For general university requirements, see <u>Graduation Requirements</u> (https://ga.rice.edu/undergraduate-students/academic-policies-procedures/graduation-requirements/). Students pursuing the BA degree with a major in Sport Management must complete:

- A minimum of 15 courses (45-48 credit hours, depending on course selection) to satisfy major requirements.
- A minimum of 120 hours to satisfy degree requirements.
- A minimum of 9-10 courses (27-32 credit hours), depending on major concentration declared, taken at the 300-level or above.
- A maximum of 6 courses (18 credit hours) from study abroad or transfer credit after matriculation at Rice may be applied towards specific major requirements. For additional departmental guidelines regarding transfer credit, see the Policies tab.

   Management, students must additionally identify and declare one of
   two major concentrations, either in:
  - Sport Law (p. 1): designed to prepare our graduates for law school. or
  - Sport Leadership: (https://ga.rice.edu/programsstudy/departments-programs/social-sciences/sportmanagement/sport-management-ba-leadershipconcentration/#requirementstext) designed to prepare our

graduates for management, leadership, and entrepreneurial roles within the sport industry.

Because of the common core requirements, it is possible for students to change their major concentration at any time, even after initially declaring the major. To do so, please contact the Office of the Registrar (registrar@rice.edu).

The courses listed below satisfy the requirements for this major. In certain instances, courses not on this official list may be substituted upon approval of the major's academic advisor, or where applicable, the department's Director of Undergraduate Studies. (Course substitutions must be formally applied and entered into Degree Works by the major's Official Certifier (https://registrar.rice.edu/facstaff/degreeworks/officialcertifier/).) Students and their academic advisors should identify and clearly document the courses to be taken.

### Policies for the BA Degree with a Major in Sport Management and a Major Concentration in Sport Law

#### **Program Restrictions and Exclusions**

Students pursuing the BA Degree with a Major in Sport Management and a Major Concentration in Sport Law should be aware of the following program restrictions:

 Students pursuing the major in Sport Management may pursue only one major concentration within the major.

#### **Transfer Credit**

Some departments and programs have additional restrictions on transfer credit. Students are encouraged to meet with their academic program's transfer credit advisor when considering transfer credit possibilities.

#### **Departmental Transfer Credit Guidelines**

Students pursuing the major in Sport Management should be aware of the following departmental transfer credit guidelines:

- No more than 6 courses (and a maximum of 18 credit hours) of transfer credit from U.S. or international universities of similar standing as Rice may apply towards specific major requirements after matriculation at Rice.
- Requests for transfer credit will be considered by the program director (and/or the program's official transfer credit advisor) on an individual case-by-case basis.

<u>Please Note</u>: Additional transfer courses may count toward meeting university graduation requirements, but not toward fulfillment of requirements for the major. Credits awarded to transfer students for courses taken prior to matriculation at Rice are not counted against the departmental limit on transfer courses, but all students must complete more than half of their upper-level major coursework (300-level and 400-level courses) at Rice.

Students pursuing the major concentration in Sport Law are encouraged to enroll in PLST 401 and/or PLST 402 in order to receive out-of-class developmental training.
